If for some reason it was no reapproved, then Mountain Park would be responsible for the cost of generator. Couple options: 1. take the risk of getting the extension approved or 2. de-obligate the current grant and reapply. In the CDBG grant there will be a pad on site and a transfer switch. So, when we are able to get generator, we won't have to worry about the components.

Amanda Allen addressed the board about the Community cleanup. She had many ideas that she wanted to share with the board about what she feels will be effective in cleaning up the town. Adam welcomed her help in every aspect.

EMS: Waiting on survival flight. Snyder asked that if Mountain Park would consider helping supply a carport for the Ambulance. Roosevelt has offered to give \$1000.00 for the cause. The trailer that hoses the EMS needs new skirting. They will have to submit a formal request.

Police: 113 total citations,

Code Enforcement:

Tracy Sullivan from Altus is very well versed in court proceedings. Kelly will gladly excerpt any help in the court arena. This is the newest endeavor that needs to be handled correctly.
